SCRIPTURES

Today's reading comes from the book of Luke 3:1- 6 NRSV

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, and Herod was ruler of Galilee, and his brother Philip ruler of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias ruler of Abilene, during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah in the wilderness.

He went into all the region around the Jordan, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the words of the prophet Isaiah,

"The voice of one crying out in the wilderness:
'Prepare the way of the Lord;
make his paths straight.

Every valley shall be filled, and every mountain and hill shall be made low, and the crooked shall be made straight, and the rough ways made smooth, and all flesh shall see the salvation of God.'"

SERMON

The Name -

Today's reading is filled with names.

The Who's who of historical names.

The names of the powerful and perhaps for that time the famous.

Pontius Pilate the governor.

Herod the ruler of Galilee.

His brother Philip ruler of Iturea and Trachonitis.

Lysanias, ruler of Abilene

The Chief-Priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas.

Then you have the son of Zachrias, John.

Not John ruler, governor, brother of, priestess of, chief of something. Nope.

I have been going to a predominant Black Affirming Pentecostal Church in south Dallas from the Fellowship of Affirming Ministries.

I drive an hour out to go to this congregation.

Yes I am an ordained Pastor but I go there for community and for my younglings to have a place to go to Sunday school and also have community.

One thing I noticed at my church of attendance is that everyone has a name or a title.

When I first started going I simply introduced myself as Yadi. I was not there to preach, teach, or lead but to simply find community and be among the flock. But they have called me Rev. Yadi since my arrival.

There is also brother, sister, deacon, elder, sibling, Pastor, and the list of titles go on.

One day, I asked a fellow clergy there who also attends the church why the titles.

She said, because historically it was the church the only place where people had respect, or were seen as something other than property.

And those who have gone to school and have received a title it is known that it came with great sacrifice, so it is honored. It is simply respect one not given out there much.

Ah, it made sense and from that point on I'm the Rev.

John is just John but Luke wants us to know where he came from the son of Zacharias.

Who is that?

Well because his dad was a Priest but he was also the husband of Elizabeth the a relative to Jesus mom, Mary.

So they are cousins, and John is the first known PK. (Pastor's kid)

I find this intriguing. My youngling walks around calling himself a pk since given that title.

But check this nugget of information out.

It is in Luke 1:39-45 that we first see John's name when Mary visited her cousin Elizabeth, who was also pregnant.

When Mary entered the house and greeted Elizabeth, the baby inside Elizabeth leaped

in her womb.

All this got me thinking John was ready to get to work!

John had a mission and a calling to be the one who announces, and creates a path for Jesus ministry.

We hear all those titles, rulers, governor, Chief but none of them are doing anything for the people, they are the Empire.

Which leads to the realization that regardless of the context of its political history, the message of hope, of joy, and good news is moving forward. Such is our standing as people of faith.

Regardless of who sits in the White House, Parliament, Kingdoms, and Palaces, we move forward with the message of hope, joy, and good news.

John comes from the wilderness, a place of withdrawal, a place of testing, a place of solitude.

Perhaps John was an introvert.

I once read a leadership book titled "The introverted leader," that blew my mind. Basically it said that introverts think, plan, sit and ponder their moves and steps.

Most of them are how to avoid too much attention to themselves while doing the job right and efficiently.

Makes sense that they can be great leaders even in the background! Well, maybe John was a bit of both cause he had no problem going out to preach and call out Herod's sin.

The City of Tiberi us was built by Herod Antipas and it sits on the Sea of Galilee during this time.

It is in the sea of Galilee where the Jordan river flows into that John goes out to share the message of good news.

It is in this area that Herod is able to hear John speaking regarding repentance of sins and the forgiveness of them.

This is what eventually gets John killed, he calls Herod out about living a sinful life.

Stay with me here.

I believe that regardless of our stand in our lives whether we are introverts or extroverts or both, we are valuable to the mission and vision of God.

In our own ways as introverts we share the good news of hope, joy, and love when we are kind to others.

Some are great activists writing letters and planning things while the extroverts go out and march.

John was in the wilderness and from there he went out to call for people to make a way. He calls for people to make room.

He calls out to clear the way.

Such is our Advent services as we light the candles as a reminder to make the way, and prepare for the birth of Jesus.

Today we light the candle of Peace.

WE make way for the good news to reflect peace.

Peace that comes from letting go and from feeling and understanding forgiveness.

Did you know what the greek world is Aphiēmi which is letting go or to release. John comes out from the wilderness and calls out make way, prepare to let go. Prepare to be at peace.

Prepare to find your peace when you let go, when you come and be Baptist as a symbol of rebirth and renewal.

Forgiveness was not in the water.

Forgiveness is not on the words of accepting Jesus and salvation.

Forgiveness, the good news is from making way and then letting go.

I once heard a person say I want to be follower of Jesus and be a good person but if you only knew the kind of person I have been.

If you only knew the kind of things that I have done.

Let go.

Prepare the way this advent to light up the candle to peace, to make way for the real love of the one who calls you to be made new.

John says clear the way.

There is all around us the "bus-yness" and the demanding schedules of a year coming to an end and things at work or at home having to wrap up.

The central message of today is prepare the way -

It comes from the wilderness not from emperors, or governors or big names but from the wilderness.

Friends as we clean our houses, make room for the tree, the gifts, or simply the lights and candles of the season, make way for the light of peace to be born in you, let go.

Let it be so.

Amen
