SERMON - The gift of wisdom

We are two days away from the new 2025 year. That means new possibilities and great things ahead!

Throughout our Advent journey, we have explored the themes of joy, hope, peace, and love, all of which are woven into the fabric of our lives. Church these themes are not just a church thing, let me share with you, how capitalism can cash in on these themes.

See, many industries from fitness, wellness, and food catering services know they can create revenue on hope, change, peace and joy. A shared hope to change for the better and start again. Change created first within and then shared with the world.

The peace that comes with better sleep, better help a better life. The joy that comes with new gadgets, fun things.

But joy my friends as we know is not really happiness. For joy transcends where we are at the moment with or without money, or new gadgets. A joy that surpasses understanding because it is not grounded on what we have or want but what is inside us.

However, we do live in a capitalist world. So as I drive around town, my eyes wander up and catch glimpses of food prep kits, Yoga classes and mindfulness spas designed to better my life in the year to come. In Social media I see promotions to apps, software, digital things that are calling me to transform my life with their help!

There are also enticing deals on gym memberships brimming with activities and fresh options for healthier eating habits and the latest trend community!

Now I see ads, and micro commercials that invite one to work out in a community and build lasting friendships. So why not get a Peloton and a subscription to go with it?!

Come build lasting friendships or bring the whole family and sign up for the family package deal. One ad that caught my attention in my email actually said: " P.S they don't have to be your real family." Clever! See all these things present strategies for enhancing my sleep quality, thanks to sales on superior mattresses just in time for the new year.

The opportunities are plentiful, and with the countdown to a new year underway, the prospect of leveling up in 2025 is incredibly exciting!

How are you doing? Have you seen these ads? Have you been tempted with these new ideas to level up this 2025?

The most entertaining meme I've come across features a Chihuahua dog on the phone, with a caption that reads "Making sure I'm signed up for highly blessed and favored packaged and not the trials and tribulations package I received last year." I absolutely love this, and I wanted to ask, what is that number so I can also verify I didn't get last year's package!

Change and transformation ultimately hinge on individual choice, regardless of the humor and enticing offers that surround us.

The various apps and deals available serve merely as enhancements or tools to help us reach our goals. However, without a genuine commitment to change—whether that means adopting a new routine, engaging in workouts, or exploring new opportunities—these resources and tools will remain ineffective. We can accumulate knowledge through self-care books and ideas, but until we make the conscious decision to act, all that information will simply remain as suggestions rather than catalysts for real growth.

In today's reading, the Apostle Paul writes this letter to the Corinthians, encouraging them to recognize their collective efforts as a community enriched by unique gifts. He emphasizes that everyone possesses something valuable to contribute, and the Holy-One is aware of these gifts and their timing for the benefit of all.

Every talent bestowed upon us originates from the Holy-One, shaping our actions and existence. When utilized thoughtfully, these divine gifts hold immense power. Just like the people in Corinth from many centuries ago we are all human beings learning to live in community, work in community and belong to one another, no subscription necessary.

We are all connected, regardless of our diverse backgrounds, religions, or origins. As children of God, we are called to both give and receive love. The Apostle Paul illustrates this connection through the analogy of the human body, reminding us of our interdependence.

Each of our bodies have different functions, and different ways to co-exist. The church in Corinth aspired to be spiritual and grounded in righteousness, yet they often overlooked the fact that those around them carry gifts to support one another in ministry, and in life as a community.

In particular I want to highlight that God's design for our bodies serves as a blueprint for our collective life as a church, where every part relies on the others.

When one part is in distress, the entire body shares in that struggle and healing, and when one part thrives, we all celebrate together. That should be how we function as a community that when one member of the community suffers, we all feel the pain.

In our world today we see and hear how church people often pass judgments based on appearances.

Perhaps the way someone looks, talks, or acts leaves little to desire or acknowledge that powerful gift from adobe resides within.

This tendency to label can lead to exclusion, as people may feel dismissed for being too old, small, tall, uneducated, uncivilized, unhappy, or even boring.

Some might think they are too introverted or too extroverted, further complicating their sense of belonging.

But friends true wisdom lies in nurturing our relationships within the community, recognizing the sacredness in everyone we meet.

Imagine the trans-formative power our nation would have if we all approached one another with unwavering respect and dignity, regardless of who we love and what our gender identity and gender expression are. When I am asked to share what it means to be a Pastor at First UCC in 2nd Life, I often say that I absolutely love the way we care for each other, for practicing blind grace.

Blind grace, because regardless of our avatars and how we present ourselves, we are divine, sacred and held in the highest esteem, because each avatar is directed by a person made in the imago dei (The image of God.)

Deep spirituality friends invite us to reveal the closeness of our relationship with God and Jesus in our lives and how we treat each other. There are many times where we do not know what others are experiencing in their lives. I invite you to acknowledge the parenthood of God and the kinship of all those around us.

Because church it is in that wisdom that comes from pain and suffering where we learn empathy. Let the painful moments of our lives not desensitize how we see and experience the pain of others, but rather connect us on a deeper level.

They say that when one gets older that one gets wiser.

But I have met some mean old people who have grown angry, bitter, and alone. Often the alone part is the cycle of the other two, angry and bitter.

My friend who is an end-of-life chaplain tells me stories of people who are the kindest people and some who till the end are mean. My friend told me but regardless of their behavior remember that perhaps it is a shell of self-preservation, or protection. We as people of God pray for them, stand out of harm's way but show love through our actions not by arguing or frustrating them further.

Oh this lesson came alive in my life this past few weeks. See in Real life I work for a company that offers digital skills to those in marginalized communities. One of the classes I just concluded had this elderly lady on a motorized wheelchair.

She often tried to run me over when I would open the door for her. Sometimes when walking around the class trying to teach. But yours truly was fast. I often will call her out in a loving and joking way, "Mrs...are you trying to run me over or give me a ride?"

Church, what I did not know was that she was upset because she felt that the gift cards given to others at our end of class raffle was rigged and unfair. I did not know this but the Spirit nudged me and she finally "won". At the end of the five weeks of meeting once a week she came to me and said, "I'm sorry I was mean to you and I'm glad you did not quit." But she said, "Yadi, I should have just asked for help but the truth is I really needed this Walmart gift card to buy groceries."

This year, may you experience the manifestation of spiritual wisdom and the gifts of the spirit in your life. It is essential we don't jump quickly to condemn someone but rather pray and hold it in your heart that no harm comes to you. In the coming year and today, may you hold the image of Jesus Christ in your heart, mind, and spirit, allowing it to guide your life throughout all seasons.

Spiritual wisdom seeks a deeper spiritual foundation that enriches your life, guided not just by the passage of time (Chronos) but by the profound lessons the Spirit of the living God imparts to you.

"Chronos" is not only time that wakes you up and keeps you moving in space, but may remind you to keep your heart in sync with the one above.

Friends look at your gifts and see how they connect with your spirituality and the wisdom from above

And may this New Year bring you awareness. Awareness of what triggers your anger, frustration, anxiety and depression. Make a note of it. Allow yourself to feel your feelings whatever they might be and see when they often show up. Make a note of it. Slow down your breathing when you feel overwhelmed and visualize images that bring you peace. Make a note of it. If you have a doctor, spiritual guide, counselor, or a supportive friend, take the time to explore your feelings before they become overwhelming.

This year friends, I invite you to recognize God as our Creator, Redeemer, and Sustainer of our faith and one that holds us even when we are broken into many pieces.

Church I invite you this year to be conscious of the environments around you and ask yourself if they bring joy to your lives?

I challenge you to name what you faced this year, and left you feeling drained? Take a moment to reflect on it, (no need to share).

But in those challenging times, I invite you to wonder if God was in the midst of it? Could you feel in some way being cared for from above?

Was there anything that brought a brief moment of joy? Life can be tough, and for many, this year has brought loss or significant struggles. Some of us may still be navigating through tough times.

Yet, I hold onto hope for you and our community, wishing for us to embrace joy, peace, and love. Just like desert flowers that store water to endure harsh conditions, may we find the strength to thrive despite our circumstances and cultivate a deep thirst for wisdom and spirituality.

A wisdom that thirst for spirituality. The blend of resilience and hope enables us to not only endure our challenges but also to progress toward a life of abundance and fulfillment.

This deep yearning for justice and divine insight leads us to Jesus, who offers us the refreshing waters we seek in the vast landscapes of our existence.

Spiritual wisdom, particularly, directs us to Christ, who invites all who are thirsty to come to Him, as stated in John 7:37.

Our actions reflect our wisdom, and the distinct talents we hold are intended to support each other.

This profound insight inspires us to seek completeness and to make significant progress. It is this synergy that enables us, amid challenges, not merely to endure but to advance toward a life of abundance and fulfillment.

The spiritual wisdom from above us calls us into wholeness and into action.

Jonathan Jackson Jr, in In Search of Wisdom, says, "A spirituality of wisdom deals with the infiniteness of God and God's creation, which encompasses all that is, all that lies beyond what is observable and verifiable, yet brings everything together."

Through the lens of spiritual wisdom, we can see the whole picture. For those with the gift of clarity who can see the bigger picture may you be the light to those of us who might not see it.

But even if we can't see things clearly at times may we know we can still hold on to hope.

In the midst of turmoil and uncertainty, take a moment to pause and listen to the quiet voice urging you to persevere and hold on to joy.

This year, let's be mindful of how we engage in both digital spaces and real life, fostering kindness towards ourselves and each other.
