Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you.

SERMON - BLESSED BE

The Beatitudes in Matthew 5:1-12 was one of my grandmother's favorite passages.

I remember being young and listening to her reading them one by one pausing at each for dramatic effect.

The story of Jesus teaching his disciples and talking to an eager crowd who would listen to every word he was saying.

Grandmother would emphasize a few verses more than others.

Like....

Blessed are the meek.

To be met means to be gentle, humble, patient, not complaining.

My abuelita really wanted me to chill.

It was te calmas (you chill) o te calmo (I chill you).

She would often say after this, its biblical.

I might have been too young to understand that some of these blessed are the poor in spirit.

I understood this as if I do not cause trouble, and live a good righteous life, God will bless me.

There was nothing about being poor in spirit.

It was really translated as poor as in unhouse, no money, and or having nothing.

What does it mean to be poor in spirit?

To me it means not having that richness of being deep within spiritual things. But who decides what that really means?

We can go down a rabbit hole about mercy, grace, love, humility and what does it mean to be rich in spirit.

The way I see it is to need, to want, to crave, to know that one is always seeking to be filled with the spirit of God which translates to being merciful, loving God as we love ourselves and each other.

Today it seems that it's not just about working hard but rather knowing how to get ahead by only trusting yourself.

Or seeing that the rich, the well off and centered people within power are going to be okay in todays world.

What would these Beatitudes look like in todays world or based on today's social expectations?

How about...

Blessed are the rich, in things and in self-assurance.

Blessed are those untouched by loss.

Blessed are the powerful.

Blessed are those who are "realistic" about righteousness, compromising at every turn.

Blessed are those who demand and exact an eye for an eye.

Blessed are the crafty and opportunistic.

Blessed are those bold enough to make war and strike first.

Blessed are those who, doing good things, receive many accolades.

Blessed are those who, following Jesus, are widely praised and adored.

Blessed are those who know best and the right people.

Will these blessings make more sense that the blessings we read in our scriptures

today?

Each of these are an obvious blessing.

The rich are blessed with more money.

The powerful are obviously blessed when they control everything.

The crafty and opportunities seemed to be blessed when they got ahead in life.

It's a dog-eat-dog world.

A Darwin thinking of survival of the fittest.

These modern blessings totally make sense because they appear to be working for many.

Right?

However, in a classic manner, Jesus consistently manages to turn things upside down.

You see, Jesus had this peculiar method that defied logic, much like algebra. I once debated with my dad, claiming that all the money he invested in my algebra tutoring was pointless, as I have yet to find any practical use for that knowledge.

But perhaps that was the point to sit through things and figure things out when they are not obviously there or make sense.

Same thing with Jesus he had these sayings: "You have heard this..."
"BUt I say to you this...."

You have heard if someone hits you, hit them back. (This makes sense right?) Or as Madea, a Tyler Perry character says, "I'm not angry. When you are getting got...I'm gonna get them first."

Put that in Jesus' formula and it comes out like, "When you are gettingdon't go get them back."

Now that's not what people expected to hear.

The popularity of shows like The Mold, The Traitors, The Deck, Big Brother, and The Amazing Race can be attributed to the competitive nature of reality television, where participants compete for prizes.

However, it's important to note that these aren't truly live broadcasts. A friend of mine who worked on one of these productions revealed that the editing process involves sifting through countless hours of footage to highlight the most dramatic moments that captivate viewers.

Audiences are drawn to conflict and confrontation rather than the gentle bonds of familial love.

This might reflect a deeper game of life, where challenges test our resilience and commitment, perhaps echoing the lessons Jesus imparted about maintaining inner peace amidst sabotage.

Ultimately, these life hurdles may reveal our true strength and dedication as we

navigate our journeys.

Today we live in a world of instant gratification.

The news at your fingertips.

Buying things right off your phone on an app as soon as you think about them.

Teens today are not used to researching or going to the library to look for anything, they got Goggle, they got their phones.

So perhaps when Jesus was saying you will receive a blessing, you will see the face of God. It was a future promised that honestly seems to take way too long.

We would have to wait to see and receive those things, as if.

Now you know the obvious question is, when? When do you see the blessings?

Perhaps it was my upbringing in a conservative evangelical mindset that I equated being blessed with finding favor before the eyes of God.

Like the Modern Beatitudes I will be blessed and rich.

But...

If I lost my job, I did something wrong.

If I could not pay my bills, I did something wrong.

I must have short changed God somewhere and my prosperity went out the window and now I am sooo not blessed or highly favored.

Does any of this sound familiar?

When the world says blessed and highly favored people are those who have a table full of food.

Jesus flips it and says blessed are those who have nothing.

Now how does this make sense?

Perhaps at first glance it does not make sense.

But if you look again it's showing us this new way of thinking.

In all he did, Jesus would teach his disciples a new way of looking at things. He would do it by walking alongside them, by performing miracles and this case sitting around talking to them.

Jesus was showing us all a new social and economic practice filled with hope.

This was a way of looking at the empire and the realm of God side by side.

The difference of putting all your hope on what the world gives you or what you can earn for yourself.

Right next to the blessings that God gives you regardless of what you did, have done, or will do.

You don't have to fight each other to receive a blessing.

See despite a change in your finances, or a loss, you are still blessed, God is there.

Jesus was talking about blessings that had nothing to do with what the Roman empire said or did.

Today they have nothing to do with what the empire says we deserve or not.

God's favor is yours and it is not measured on attitude.

The world wants us to believe you have to deserve things.

Food, water, shelter, and safety should not be something that only those who deserve the good stuff has.

It should also NOT be only for those who in their eyes God has found favor.

You are blessed when you are authentic and know wholeness.

Be kind so you can see others benefit from your awesomeness.

Comfort, because you know what it means when someone comforts you.

Live your life in a way that is marked by justice, practices of piety, and shared accessible resources. You will see blessings all around you, my friends.

Jesus very well could have been telling us today you have heard your life is a game and you deserve to win at all cost.

But I tell you, there is no need to stress, the blessing is yours.

Name calling, bullying, rumors, social antagonisms are inevitable when the Empire puts people against each other and when the powerful are challenged.

But the challenge that the Holy one gives you is to stand against the Empire and to know your truth by the way you live.

We are a community united by the belief that comfort is attainable, especially for those in pain. This promise not only speaks to the future but also embodies the hope we find in Christ today.

As a church, let us embody compassion and righteousness, actively pursuing justice. For you and I continue to dedicate ourselves to illuminating the way for those who feel lost in despair, providing solace and a welcoming space within our community that honors the Divine.

May those who continue to seek the realm of God through prayers, and faith in action find the assurance of God's call.

For we are assured that amidst life's challenges, great rewards await us now and always.
